## Letter from the Eminent Archon

Greetings to Brothers of Iowa Delta,

To my fellow Brothers,

It has been an honor to serve as Eminent Archon this past year, and I am proud to share with you the exciting progress and positive changes that have taken place at Iowa Delta. From academics to recruitment, philanthropy, and our on-campus image, we've worked hard to build upon the foundation laid by those who came before us.

**Grades and Academics:** One of my key priorities as Eminent Archon has been to maintain and enhance the academic momentum we built last year. I'm pleased to say that our Scholarship Chairman, Mason Sommers, has done an outstanding job. He's organized daily study hours, either in the house or the library, to ensure academic focus remains strong. Additionally, Mason assembled a committee of our most successful brothers from each major to lead tutoring sessions and specialized study hours. These changes have us aiming to rise from having the third-highest GPA among fraternities to securing the top spot on Greek Street. We've also shifted our approach with brothers who fall below the GPA requirement. Rather than emphasizing punishment, we've found that motivation and incentives are far more effective in helping our brothers succeed.

**Recruitment:** Recruitment has historically been a challenge for us, particularly as we lost 11 seniors in the spring. But this year, we made remarkable strides. With the help of Iowa Delta alumnus Noah BG, who graciously returned to assist with recruitment training, we set an ambitious goal of bringing in 10 new members. I'm proud to report that we surpassed that, welcoming 13 new brothers into our chapter, bringing our total to 53 members. While we brought in the second-highest number of recruits behind Sig Ep, who added 14 members, this marks a significant achievement for us. Currently, 15 brothers reside in the chapter house, with the remainder living on campus or in nearby neighborhoods.

**On-Campus Persona and IFC:** Our chapter continues to lead within the campus community, maintaining a strong and positive reputation. We have held the presidency of the Inter-Fraternity Council (IFC) for the past four years, with Rodrigo Gonzalez, an SAE senior, serving as the current IFC President. Together, we have worked diligently to not only elevate the image of SAE at Drake University but also to strengthen our ties with nearby chapters like Iowa State University. In line with this, we've been hosting diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) events on campus, as well as HIRO (Human Interaction, Respect, and Outreach)

events, to promote inclusivity. We've also taken steps within our chapter house to ensure our environment is welcoming to all. Menstrual products are now available in our bathrooms for any guests in need. For this year's Halloween celebration, we are excited to be partnering with the Coalition of Black Students to create an inclusive and engaging event for the broader community.

**Philanthropy and Service:** This year, our philanthropic efforts continue to grow. We have two major events planned. The first is a concert hosted and promoted by SAE, with all proceeds benefiting Movember, an organization supporting men's health. ## IOWA DELTA ALUM (DAVE STONE '73) & THE WAVELAND CAFÉ IN DES MOINES

A local eatery on University Avenue in Des Moines (near Drake University) is celebrating four decades of service this year. Waveland Cafe is known for its delicious breakfast food and quality service. It's been a staple in Des Moines for 40 years. David "Stoney" Stone (Iowa Delta '73) has been the owner for 33 of those years. He said the key to success is consistency. "They [customers] don't get any surprises. They know if they come in next week, or next month, or two or three years, or five years, they're going to have the same feeling when they come in," said Stoney, "It would be hard for us to come into Waveland and not be in a better mood when you left."

Hashbrowns are one of their top menu items. Stone said they go through two to three tons of hashbrowns in a month. They're known for having the "best in the galaxy," but Stone said his employees are what make the place special. "I treat them as if they're family. They treat the people here as if they're family. Our employees know our customers, know their kids, and they know their kids' birthdays.

But, Stoney also said the atmosphere is unique because they have a mix of several different types of people. Despite their small size, it's not rare for all 55 seats to be filled every day. "We don't have a lot of people in here on their phone. Because they're talking to each other," he said.

They serve high school students from Roosevelt, college students from Drake, professionals who work in the area, community members, and even big celebrity names like Jason Momoa, Stephen Colbert, Neil Diamond, Tyler Childers, and more.

And customers say Waveland earned its great reputation.

"We love it. It's just a great atmosphere, it's family-like and that's why we love coming. And the food is great," said Sherri White, a long-time customer.

Waveland will soon have t-shirts for sale at the cafe to celebrate the milestone.

The Waveland Café is located at 4708 University Avenue in Des Moines and they're open from 6 am to 2 pm Monday through Saturday and 8 am to 2 pm on Sundays. A second location is located in Booneville, just west of metro Des Moines.





# HOW TWO DRAKE SAE'S INITIATED A LONG-DISTANCE MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

## Mike Peterson (1975 Drake SAE):

One of the takeaways from my 40+ year career in sales and marketing is the invaluable counsel and direction I received from a number of outstanding mentors. This was especially the case during my nearly 30 years with Meredith Corporation, where I served as Vice President and Publisher and experienced firsthand the tremendous impact mentors had on my career. Based on the many benefits I received from mentors, I continue to mentor others as they navigate their individual career journeys.

One of my current mentees is Logan Zweifel, a 2022 Business graduate of my alma mater, Drake University. As a 1975 graduate of Drake and 5 years into retirement, I began working with Logan during his final year of college. As Logan's graduation approached, he asked if we could continue our mentoring relationship once he moved to Philadelphia and started his new job with Food Export USA Northeast. I immediately said yes and for the last two years we've communicated via phone for 60 minutes each month. Additionally, Logan has sent me a number of documents for my review and feedback and I've sent him a variety of business-related articles I believed would be beneficial. He also knows he can contact me at anytime to discuss specific issues.

So that readers of this article have a clear picture of how our long-distance mentoring relationship has evolved, I asked Logan to share how he has benefited from having a mentor, which I think he has done very effectively below. As to the future, I've told Logan I'm fully committed to continuing as a mentor as long as this program remains meaningful and relevant. I'm also looking forward to witnessing Logan's continued growth and development. From what I've already seen from Logan, I'm extremely confident this talented Drake grad will enjoy a very successful and rewarding career.

## Logan Zweifel (2022 Drake SAE):

### How We Got Started:

Having met during several events at Drake University, including an American Marketing Association Speed Networking event and Sigma Alpha Epsilon Executive Forum, Mike Peterson and I formally developed a mentoring relationship during my senior year of college. This was an exciting and daunting time for me as I geared up for the unknown of life after graduation. With Mike as a mentor, I was able to navigate this next phase of life more confidently. Of course, I also had great support from my family and friends, but mentorship added a uniquely different aspect.

### Transition from School to Professional Environment:

In March of 2022, I accepted a job in Philadelphia upon graduation in May. There are many moving pieces when experiencing a cross-country move to begin a new job. Some are personal that your family or friends can help with and some are professional. Having Mike as a mentor helped me navigate this move to a new city and gave me confidence to not only adapt to a new professional environment, but to thrive early in my career. Learning from Mike's past experiences and perspectives has played a significant role in the continued development of a diligent work ethic, which has already caught the eye of the senior leadership team.

### Advice on Challenges Faced:

I have fortunately been given several exciting opportunities based on my early performance, but with these have come a number of new challenges. I've been able to discuss these challenges with Mike to learn from his own career experiences and have received helpful input on how to work through them. These types of conversations create a natural sense of accountability for the next time we check-in via our monthly phone calls. Mike's perspective has been continuously important throughout each stage of my professional career. As new opportunities continue to arise, so do new challenges, which makes the value of a resource like Mike indispensable.

## Support From Outside of Industry/Family:

I trust that Mike's advice is in support of my best interests, even if it's not always something I want to hear. Outside counsel from an established and trusted source is a great thing for all professionals, especially young professionals like myself. In the fall of 2023, I began the application process for Graduate School. Once again, Mike provided helpful insights and observations as I pondered which degree to receive and from what school. I still remember Mike sending me a very helpful and informative article he discovered while researching the subject on my behalf. This one example represents the level of interest he has taken in my career. Applying to Graduate School highlighted yet another benefit of having a mentor who is genuinely interested in both my professional development and career advancement.

### Personal Experience:

Accomplished executives like Mike can play an important role in helping shape the next generation of business leaders and how they advance their careers. We definitely need more opportunities to develop productive mentorships with people who are willing to share their experiences and expertise, especially with those just getting started in their careers. Having meaningful 1:1 conversation with a mentor is a sure way to become more knowledgeable and intentional in your behavior. I certainly learned a great deal from Mike while discussing a wide variety of topics over the last two years, such as understanding and navigating different corporate cultures, maximizing strengths and minimizing weaknesses, the importance of being perceived as a positive, determined individual, being a supportive team player, developing positive relationships with company leadership, continued focus on soft skills, being proactive and strategic in developing new business, improving time management skills, continuing to learn about your industry and your competition, providing outstanding customer service, bringing exceptional value and service to customers, and consistently differentiating yourself as a high performing, solution-focused employee. The experiences, stories, and advice I've received from Mike will stick with me throughout my career. Our relationship has become increasingly important

as I've progressed from navigating internships while at Drake to navigating my first big work-related business pitch. As I'm sometimes my worst critic, Mike's assessment of my development is always helpful. I also appreciate that Mike consistently goes out of his way to offer astute counsel, as he has demonstrated multiple times. I would close by saying relationships with a mentor will obviously vary from person to person, but the biggest piece of advice I have is: Proactively seek out potential mentors and Ask Them to serve as a Mentor. If I hadn't asked Mike to continue our mentoring relationship upon graduation, I would have unfortunately missed out on significant growth and development opportunities. For this reason alone, I could not be more confident that trusted and resourceful mentors can and will have great impact on both my career success and personal fulfilment!

# EDDIE BAEB AND THE BERWYN MASTERS: TRUE GENTLEMEN BONDING ON THE GOLF COURSE & BEYOND

Join me for a look inside the workings of what has become an annual gathering of Iowa Delta alumni brothers: The Berwyn Masters. “A Tradition...Not Too Unlike Any Other.”

Eddie Baeb (IA Delta ‘94) sits at a table in the clubhouse of a Chicago suburban golf course with a few small stacks of \$20 bills and scorecards for the 20-some players (mostly IA Delta alums) with a Berwyn Masters logo – featuring an image of the city’s famous car ka-bob – glued to the front.

Eddie’s former fraternity brother Kevin Conlee (IA Delta ‘94) hands him another scorecard he’s finished double checking. While Eddie was a journalism grad – no math required – Kevin studied actuary and also played golf at Drake. So Eddie appreciates Kevin’s help.

All but one of the golfing foursomes have finished, so Eddie’s got a good idea of who will don the coveted Olive Green Jacket for the best score (Stableford format), and who will don the ‘70s-style plaid Spaulding Jacket for the day’s worst score. They wait, and wait, and wait some more ... as the raucous din of the clubhouse laughter grows louder.

When the last group finally saunters in (after a six-hour round – which could be a WHOLE separate article!) Eddie is ready for his traditional spiel announcing the day’s results and hosting the jacket

ceremony. From there, the group heads to nearby Gibson’s steakhouse in Oak Brook for a rousing group dinner where they also watch the conclusion of “that other Masters” golf tournament.

The Berwyn Masters will celebrate its 20th anniversary this April of 2025. Its timing matched each year to that more famous event in Augusta, Georgia, and named for the gritty suburb Eddie lived

in while working as a reporter at Crain’s Chicago Business. He wanted to carve out one day a year for his crew of IA Delta alums living around Chicago to get together and expand networks with other friends and colleagues. Since Drake alums are accustomed

to wintry days at the Drake Relays, no one balked at the prospects of frost or even the occasional snow shower. One year, a blizzard dropped about 6” of snow, canceling golf. But dinner at Gibson’s still happened!

The event began as a half-dozen or so players. Jon Lueken (‘92) has been there almost every year. Other Chicagoans including Art Renier (‘94), Mark Diserio (‘94), Derek Peterson (‘93), Ken Fowler (‘93), Greg Huck (‘92), Steve Nadle and Paul Bradley (both ‘91) are regulars. Steve even brought his son one year, an SAE chapter Eminent Archon at UW-Stout!

When postings on Facebook caught the eye of Frank Ingham (‘91), the Colorado-based brother asked Eddie for an invite and flew in next year to attend ...



and it was becoming clear this little event had caught on – becoming a weekend to renew the strong bonds of brotherhood from IA Delta grads in the ‘90s and beyond. Brothers now make the trek from Colorado, California, Missouri, Arkansas, Minnesota (where Eddie now lives) and even Florida – though the Floridian refuses to golf until Eddie moves the tournament to southern climes!

In recent years, as brothers have sometimes brought heavy hearts and shared personal hardships and the joys of being 50-somethings, Baeb often invokes words he now knows come from the Bible: “How good and how pleasant it is for brothers to dwell together in unity.” Frank Ingham started a new tradition one year when he asked his former roommate, Mark Hathoot (‘91), to share a table grace before dinner. A tradition upheld beautifully by a first-timer to the event, Curt Steger (‘92), this past year.

“I recognized as an undergrad that the brothers at Iowa Delta were remarkable young men. Funny. Smart. Hard working,” Eddie says. “So bringing that group together – amazingly, most are still funny and smart as old men – means a lot to me. When I drive home each year, my face feels tired from smiling and laughing. And my soul feels renewed. Sounds sappy. But it’s true.”
